

Current Fulbright Grantees Now Connected to Fulbright Alumni Community

Seeking to enrich the experience of Fulbrighters during their grants, the Fulbright Association, assisted by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, has created an e-membership program for currently selected U.S. Fulbright grantees.

"The Fulbright alumni community can share a wealth of knowledge with current grantees," said Fulbright Association Director of Membership Development Marshall Ellis. "The new e-membership program gives current Fulbright grantees access to this knowledge base in order to enhance their Fulbright grant experience. We believe that connecting current grantees with the alumni community will enrich their experience, thus furthering the Fulbright program's mission of 'increas[ing] mutual understanding between the people of the United

States and the people of other countries...'"

The e-membership depends on current grantees maintaining a valid e-mail address to take advantage of the benefits, which are electronic.

"Communicating with e-members solely through electronic means is the only way that makes sense," according to Mr. Ellis. "There are over 1,700 U.S. Fulbrighters in more than 100 countries—the postage costs of mailing membership communications to this group alone would be prohibitively expensive. Using e-mail allows the Fulbright Association to know that membership communications are being received in a timely fashion. If we relied on regular mail, communications could take weeks to be delivered. If the grantee moves, we may end up losing touch."

Going forward, all U.S.

Fulbright grantees will be eligible for the special, free e-membership during the time of their grant, allowing them to take advantage of the features of the Fulbright Association's online community to connect with each other and with alumni who have been in their host countries and elsewhere.

Grantees will be informed by the Fulbright Association after Sept. 1 each year about their free e-membership and information necessary to register for the Association's online community. Grantees who have previously received a Fulbright grant are not eligible for the e-membership.

Fulbright Association Web Site and Online Community Update

The Fulbright Association's revamped web site and online community for Fulbrighters launched in April 2003 are experiencing great success. The secure, password-protected online community provides many tools to facilitate lifelong interaction among alumni and current participants, a goal outlined in the Association's mission statement. Features of the online community include an online directory with information on more than 50,000 Fulbrighters, a calendar of Association and chapter events, message boards, alumni notes, and a chat room. A career center and mentoring service are also part of the online community and can be

helpful to Fulbrighters looking for professional advice, searching for a job, or searching for an employee. Access to the online community is a membership benefit.

Nearly 5,900 Fulbrighters have registered for the online community with more than 500 posting photographs in their online directory listings. The *Alumni Notes* section has almost 100 updates on Fulbrighters, ranging from announcements of books published to job promotions.

The *Mentoring Service* has proved to be a popular feature among younger alumni, current Fulbrighters, and those transitioning to new careers. Individuals can



search the mentor postings for a mentor and create a "mentoree" posting explaining what they are looking for in a mentor. Members interested in serving as a mentor are encouraged to create a "mentor" posting.

Association Members Receive Inaugural Harrison H. Schmitt Leadership Award

Secretary of State Colin Powell presented Fulbright Association members Raymond M. Jefferson (Singapore 2001) and Jason A. Santamaria (Venezuela 1993) the Harrison H. Schmitt Leadership Award for Alumni of the Fulbright Student Program at a special ceremony at the U.S. Department of State on July 29, 2003. Named after Fulbright alumnus, astronaut, and former U.S. Senator Harrison H. Schmitt (Norway 1958), the award honors "recent alumni of the U.S. Fulbright student program who have demonstrated extraordinary leadership in, and dedication to, public service and mutual understanding." Dr. Schmitt served on the Fulbright Association's Board of Directors from 1984 to 1986.

Mr. Jefferson is currently deputy director of Hawaii's Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism, a position to which he was appointed by Gov. Linda Lingle. He graduated from the Military Academy at West Point in 1988 and served in the U.S. Army from 1988 to 1999. Mr. Jefferson spent 2001-02 in Singapore on a Fulbright student grant researching leadership in the public sector and working with physically challenged children.

Mr. Santamaria is a management consultant and author. A 1993 graduate of the University of Texas at Austin, he received a Fulbright student grant to Venezuela in 1993 to research the energy and trade sectors of that country. Upon his return to the United States in 1994, Mr. Santamaria entered the U.S. Marine Corps and served until 1998. His book, *The Marine Corps Way: Using Maneuver Warfare to Lead a Winning Organization*, was published in December 2003. ♦

In October 2003, **Cyprus** named Fulbright alumnus Euripides L. Evriviades ambassador to the United States. Ambassador Evriviades was a Fulbright scholar at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University where he earned a master's degree in public administration in 1984. Ambassador Evriviades concurrently serves as non-resident ambassador to Brazil and high commissioner of Cyprus to Canada, Guyana, Jamaica, the Bahamas and Barbados. He also serves as permanent representative to the International Civil Aviation Organization, permanent observer to the Organization of American States, and as the official representative of Cyprus to the World Bank and International Monetary Fund.

The **ASLA-Fulbright Alumni Association (Finland)** celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2003 and held several events to mark the anniversary including a concert by the Helsinki Philharmonic Orchestra in Finlandia Hall on November 20, 2003. Chief Conductor Leif Segerstam, one of the most well known Finnish ASLA-Fulbright scholars, conducted the concert. The concert program included Ludwig van Beethoven's Leonore III overture; Karol Szymanowski's Violin Concerto 1; and Jean Sibelius' Symphony 3. The conference, hosted by the National Institute for Policy and Strategic Studies, highlighted the effects of democracy on forestry policy, agriculture,

livestock and poultry production and policy, population control, health policy, and access to affordable medication. Conference attendees defended papers on each of these topics and discussed the detrimental effects of cronyism on the stability of Nigeria's most established political parties. Planned Giving Profile

Journalist, Educator, Fulbright Scholar to Foster International Communications through Gift to Fulbright Association

Inspired by the Selma Jeanne Cohen Lecture for International Scholarship on Dance, Linda H. Scanlan has included the Fulbright Association in her planned giving. Ms. Scanlan has made a bequest to the Fulbright Association through a 457 deferred compensation plan Virginia makes available to state employees. The bequest will support a lecture in the area of international communications.

Ms. Scanlan taught at Norfolk State University for 17 years and chaired the Department of Journalism for six years, after having worked at five daily newspapers. Now a freelance writer and public relations consultant, she received her master's degree in journalism from Columbia University and a master's in higher education administration from George Washington University.

Ms. Scanlan was a Fulbright scholar in Bulgaria from 1993 to 1994 and a Fulbright senior specialist in Kosovo in 2001. She became a life member of the Fulbright Association upon returning from her Fulbright experience in Bulgaria. She has attended a number of Fulbright Association conferences and moderated conference workshops for chapter representatives.

"I have been privileged and enriched by the stimulation of attending national Fulbright Association conferences and wish more alumni could have the experience. I believe opportunities to present distinguished papers may be one means to achieve broader participation," Ms. Scanlan said. "My gift, I hope, will encourage more journalists and communication scholars to submit papers and receive modest support

to attend the conference and enrich discourse on all facets of international communications."

Ms. Scanlan helped found the Fulbright Association's Southeast Virginia Chapter and currently serves as its secretary. She has emphasized providing enriching experiences and practical help to Fulbrighters from abroad who are studying and working at institutions in Southeast Virginia. With colleagues on the chapter board, she has developed grant proposals for the chapter grant program funded by the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs of the U.S. Department of State and administered by the Fulbright Association.

Now serving her second, three-year term on the Fulbright Association's national Board of Directors, Ms. Scanlan has led a variety of initiatives. She chaired the national Board's Chapter Development Committee from 2001 to 2003. Last year, she wrote "A Media Guide for Chapters," which the national office distributed to help chapters gain greater visibility for the Fulbright program and chapter work on behalf of Fulbright exchanges. She worked with members of her committee, with the Membership Committee, on which she also served, and with the staff on developing the Association's redesigned web site and online community and directory. The map of chapter locations on the web site is a feature she proposed in order to speed connections between new Fulbrighters coming to the United

States and chapter representatives.

This year Ms. Scanlan is focusing on government and public relations as chair of the Board's

Advocacy and External Relations Committee. She hopes to strengthen Association-wide efforts to support grassroots advocacy on behalf of Fulbright exchanges and to increase understanding of the Fulbright Association's organizational identity.

Ms. Scanlan has actively followed policy issues affecting international education and has come to Washington, D.C., to participate in the Advocacy Day sponsored by the Alliance for International Educational and Cultural Exchange, a coalition that includes the Fulbright Association among its member organizations, and to attend State Department briefings.

Ms. Scanlan is also a leader in the Public Relations Society of America, as an accredited member and past chapter president who was honored with the Virginia Public Relations Medallion. Her interest and expertise in various international communications issues has led to consultancies with the former United States Information Agency and with the Agency for International Development. Ms. Scanlan has held seminars and workshops on public relations and journalism throughout Eastern Europe. She is also an active member of the International Women's Media Foundation.

On behalf of Fulbrighters around the world, the Fulbright Association thanks Ms. Scanlan for her vision, dedication, and generosity. ♦

Through the Fulbright Occasional Lecturer Program, the **Alabama Chapter** invited Dr. Jyotsna Bapat (USA 2002), a Fulbright scholar from India, to speak at Miles College, an historically black college in Birmingham. Dr. Bapat, a scholar in residence at Macalester College in St. Paul, Minn., spoke on "Global Issues: Impact of Multinational Organizations on National Identities."

Tony Redhouse, a member of the Navajo Nations, and the Black Horse Dancers, performed for visiting Fulbrighters and members of the **Arizona Chapter**. The dancers, known for telling stories through performance, began with an eagle dance and concluded with a hoop dance.

Claire Gaudiani (Morocco 1996), former president of Connecticut College, delivered the keynote address at the **Connecticut Chapter's** annual Symposium and Sunday Brunch at Yale University. Dr. Gaudiani spoke on "Philanthropy: Building Economic Growth," the topic of her new book. She focused on the relation of philanthropy to economic development in a civil society.

The **National Capital Area Chapter** organized a "Café-style" discussion on the implications of major world events of the past two years for international academic

exchanges. The participants were encouraged to discuss their own educational exchange experiences and their reactions to the 'open or closed door' conditions for international education in the post 9-11 era. The Embassy of Switzerland graciously served as the host of the event.

The **Mid Florida Chapter** arranged for visiting Fulbrighters to have a special tour of Ybor City and the Ybor City Museum. The tour was narrated by Gary Mormino (Italy 1981). Ybor City was formed circa 1880 by immigrants from Cuba, Italy, and Spain who were employed in the area's cigar factories.

The **Georgia Chapter** arranged a day long program entitled "A Glance Beneath the Mask" designed to introduce visiting Fulbrighters to the African American community in Atlanta. The first stop was the birth home of Martin Luther King, Jr. After the tour, the group visited the Apex Museum on Sweet Auburn Street, known for its African

American businesses and as the setting for many historic civil rights marches and meetings. After lunch, the group heard lectures at Spelman College on "The Effects of Standardized Tests on African American Students," "African American Religion and Culture," and "African American Scientists." The day ended with dinners with six African American families who hosted two or more scholars in their homes. The program was made possible by an enrichment grant from the Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.

In observance of the 60th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor, the **Hawaii Chapter** made arrangements for visiting Fulbright scholars, students, and teachers to visit related sites and to attend lectures and briefings. The sites included the Arizona Memorial and Museum, the Battleship Missouri, Schofield Barracks, Hickam Air Force Base, and Fort DeRussy, all key factors in the war.

The **Chicago Chapter** hosted its third annual Spring Luncheon, attended by visiting Fulbrighters, Chicago area alumni, and members of the **Wisconsin Chapter**. William J. Bauer, senior judge of the Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals, spoke on ways the American legal system enhances international cooperation.

Fulbright alumni and visiting Fulbrighters in the **Louisiana Chapter** were treated to a day at Jazz Fest in New Orleans. Jazz Fest features dozens of local, regional, and national groups performing traditional and modern jazz, regional blues, Cajun, gospel, and other music. The day began with presentations on the history of New
